Viva Energy Australia Pty. Ltd. (Viva Energy) has written to three landholders near its Coles Express Queenstown Service Station, located on the corner of Port Road and Westport Avenue Queenstown (the Site). The landholders were advised that environmental consultants (AECOM) have been engaged to undertake assessments of soil and groundwater at the Site.

Previous investigations have identified the presence of residual petroleum in the groundwater beneath the service station. AECOM are now undertaking further works to better understand the nature and extent of the petroleum hydrocarbon substances that have been found. This may involve further well installation and groundwater monitoring.

As part of these investigations, a survey of groundwater bore use and basement presence in the area adjacent to the Site has been conducted.

Surface soils, such as those in garden beds and grassed areas, are unlikely to have been affected by the impacted groundwater. However, as a precaution, AECOM has recommended that the three landholders do not extract bore water for any purpose, while the groundwater assessment is still in progress. Mains water provided by SA Water and water from rainwater tanks are not affected.

The South Australian Environment Protection Authority (EPA) is being provided with regular updates on Viva Energy's environmental investigations.
