RE: Environmental assessment works – Glenelg East

Following advice to residents in January 2015, the Environment Protection Authority (EPA) is planning to commence an environmental assessment program in the vicinity of the Glenelg Dry Cleaners (GDC) site on Cliff Street, Glenelg East.

The planned environmental assessment program will help the EPA understand the nature and extent of potential offsite contamination in the groundwater and soil vapour to the south, west and northwest of the GDC site.

Greencap has been appointed by the EPA to undertake these assessment works, which are planned to commence from Tuesday 7 April 2015. Prior to this you may see small crews throughout the area marking the location of underground services and determining final locations for the installation of new sample points ahead of drilling works.

The assessment program includes the drilling of groundwater wells and soil vapour bores, collection of samples and data analysis to provide a detailed report on the environmental conditions and a human health risk assessment. You will be notified when the results of the assessment program are available, which is currently expected to be July 2015. A fact sheet with information about the assessment program and a map of the assessment area is attached for your information.

As per previous advice provided by the EPA, residents and commercial/industrial property owners should not use bore water (groundwater) for any purpose until further notice. Mains water provided by SA Water and water from rainwater tanks are not affected by this issue.
